Please let us know by phone or email. John (jbm@fccucc.org), Elsa (elsa@fccucc.org) and Beth Harris-Hess (trained lay visitor) regularly check the hospitals. But it's often difficult to find the names of parishioners in the hospitals. The *Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA)* of 1996 has resulted in significant tightening of access to patient lists so we may not know you're hospitalized unless you tell us.

Stop Bullying This Lent

During this season, as we look toward what might be dying with Jesus, our children are praying that bullying might end in their actions. Each age group has been invited by their Sunday School teachers to think about what they might do to end bullying.

You've probably heard the horrible stories in the news. You may even have your own story about a bully from your childhood. It seems that our human relationships are more and more conflicted as we try to figure out how to speak civilly to each other and respect each other's dignity. In our Christian faith, we remind each other to love your neighbor. In Christ Kid's Club, we claimed some other Biblical language as we tried to see the "spirit of Jesus" in each other. And yet, most of us don't know what that spirit or that love looks like. We know we're supposed to do it. We just don't seem to have enough examples of how to live out that faith.

Our kids are trying to do both. They're trying to understand that love that we find in Jesus as they try to practice that love by doing simple things to stop bullying. The kids have been told that they can do whatever they want. It's their choice how they will make bullying die - but it requires their imaginations and even their honor.

In the 1st and 2nd grade class, pictured here, the kids made buttons to honor what they were doing to stop bullying. I can see artwork of two people trying to relate. In these buttons, I see the big X marks drawn over two people fighting. I see the negation of what is not loving their neighbor, but it's harder to see what positive images the children imagine as they try to imagine more love in this world. I hope that you'll take the time to ask these kids what that love looks like. I do believe that these kids know better than we do. I just hope that we are able to listen to the love that they preach.

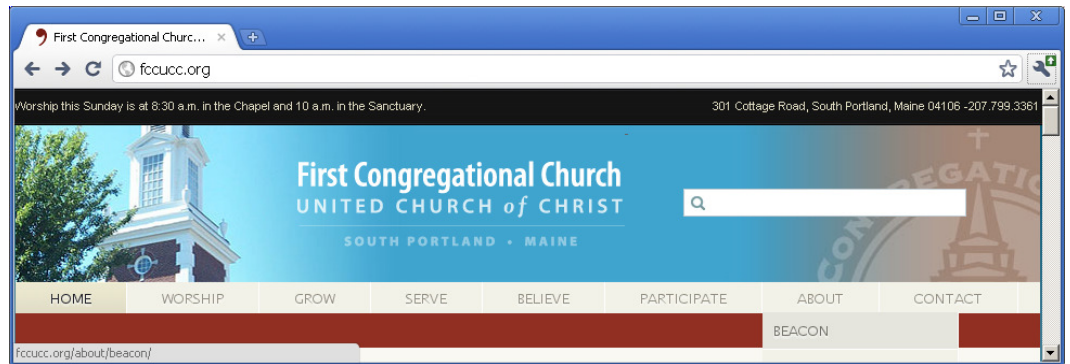

Contact Information on the Website

As you know, the Church website has recently been updated. This month and next, there will be a series of Beacon articles to describe new features on the website. Last time, we described the Beacon. This time, we will describe contact information.

As shown in the picture above, if you go to the church website (www.fccucc.org) and hover your mouse over "Contact" in the menu bar, a dropdown list of options will appear. Click on one and here is what you'll get...

Contact Form: This is an easy way to send emails to people involved with the church without having to know their email addresses. Simply enter your name and email, select who you want to contact from a dropdown list, type your message, and click "Send". The dropdown list has many entries, like Church Office, Hilltop Guild, and Senior Minister. It's that easy!

Church Referral Directory: Last year, Don Russell spearheaded the creation of this wonderful directory, intended 1) to allow members to access or refer other members, their gifts and talents, and 2) to build and deepen community within and outside the church. It has entries for painters, recreation, technical support, and much more. The directory is password protected.

If you know the password, enter it. If you don't, read below...

Church Directory: If you can't remember how to reach a member or friend of the church, this is the place to go. The directory is password protected. If you know the password, enter it. If you don't, read the next section. If you are concerned about the information in the Church Directory about you, please contact the office (you can use the Contact Form, of course!).

Church / Referral Directory Password: Since the Church Directory and the Church Referral Directory contain sensitive contact information, they are covered by the Church Member Contact Information Policy and are password protected. If you need a password to these pages, click the highlighted "here" to go to the Contact Form to request a password. The office will send out a password, as appropriate.
