Weekly Multi-Faith Vigil outside the Cumberland County Detention Center, at the corner of Congress and County Way, every Wednesday from 2:45 – 3:15 pm Community faith leaders will host these vigils to lament the harm inflicted on all those caught up in the immigration system, and to affirm the God-belovedness of all people. Each gathering may include songs, silence, prayer or other spiritual practices to honor the sacred worth of all people, and to hold up everyone involved - those detained, officers, and our entire community.

HOW DO I DECIDE HOW MUCH TO GIVE?

November is **Giving Season**, and you are invited to prayerfully consider making a pledge of financial support to First Congregational Church, UCC, South Portland, in 2026.

But how to decide how much to give?

Well, you could:

- 1. **COMPARE** how much you spend on your various monthly expenses. Ask: "How does my spending reflect what I value?" Maybe your church feels as important as laundry detergent, or your weekly coffee or electricity. OR...
- 2. **CALCULATE** a proportion of your income: 2%? 5%? 10%? This is called 'proportional giving,' or giving according to your resources. (See the back of a pledge card for a chart to help you calculate this number.) OR...
- 3. **CONTRIBUTE** to the total 'pie' All it takes to fuel our ministries: It would take about \$2,800 per pledging household to balance our current budget, if each of us gave the same sized 'slice.' Of course, the pie is not actually divided into equal portions. We have different capacities to give (and that's ok!). So it's *also* helpful to...
- 4. **CONSIDER** giving an amount that feels generous *in the context of your own financial picture*. That looks different for each of us. The goal is to give a meaningful gift. In other words, "Give until it feels good!"
- 5. **CHALLENGE** yourself to increase your giving, because God invites us to live generous lives. How might you practice your faith by giving a little more each year? Maybe even set a goal then grow towards it.

...AND (no matter what else you do):

CELEBRATE everything God has done in your life and give until you feel like you've said, "Thank you, God!"
