Lent - Easter Season

Palm Sunday, April 13, 10 am: Grab palm leaves and join the parade as Jesus enters Jerusalem.

Maundy Thursday Soup Supper Service, April 17, 5:30 - 7 pm in Guptill Hall: Gather for a shared meal, communion, and hand or foot washing.

Good Friday Hunger Walk, April 18, 6 am: Walk up to 8 miles or sponsor a walker; raise funds to fight hunger locally and globally.

Good Friday Worship, April 18, 7 pm, sanctuary: Mark the final hours of Jesus' life with scripture readings, music by the Meetinghouse Choir and prayer.

Easter Vigil, 8 pm Good Friday - Easter sunrise, in the chapel: Sign up for a two-hour block to keep watch; mark the time between Christ's crucifixion and resurrection.
